





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


# Message





I also take this opportunity to congratulate all the graduands, their teachers and parents. Today, 663 graduands will be awarded their graduate, postgraduate, and doctoral degrees and diplomas. Needless to say, our 17 Gold Medal winners deserve special accolades.

We are also extremely thankful to our Guests of Honour Shri Mohan Dhariaji and Dr. Montek Singh Ahluwalia for accepting the conferment of the Degree of Doctor of Letters. By accepting this degree, they have acknowledged our work in the field of education and boosted our morale.

Our graduands of today have been drilled and tested in a rigorous system and we are glad to present them to you. Not only are these graduates endowed with specialized knowledge in their respective fields, they have acquired necessary skills for living successfully as citizens and performing well in the world of work. In a way, they are trained as Citizen Intellectuals to think logically & act responsibly.



In the competitive world of global academia, we need to remember and be guided by the principle enshrined in the University's mission statement:

# "... To contribute to the socio-economic and ethical development of the nation, by providing high quality education through institutions, capable of developing competent professionals and liberal minded citizens."

This aspiration must stand as a beacon for the future. This shared value will drive us to continuous improvement in all aspects of our mission without compromise and I am confident that together we will achieve the goals and vision of this mission.

I would now like to present the Report on the activities at Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune since the last convocation held on March 18, 2011.

Since its inception in 2003, Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has consistently provided

high quality education through its eight institutions in the faculties of Medicine, Dentistry, Allied Medical Sciences, Nursing, Biotechnology & Bioinformatics and Management. Although nine years sound long as a time span, for an academic institution, this is a rather short period of evolution. Nonetheless, within this duration, Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has carved a niche in teaching and more importantly, in research. We also pride ourselves on our pedagogical initiatives in adaptation of synergistic teaching-learning processes and soft-skills training programmes.

#### RESEARCH

In today's world of speedier dissemination of knowledge, our students and faculty are a step ahead in sharing their opinions, research findings, and ideas with the rest of the world through publications in various media. It is commendable that the number of publications in the form of research papers, write-ups, reviews has increased steadily owing to the highly scientific and competitive attitude of the faculty and proactive encouragement by the management through various incentives. A total of 322 papers have been published in indexed journals, which are included in different data bases viz. Scopus, Web of Science, PubMed and Google Scholar, apart from the published abstracts during the year under report.

The University continues to receive funds from various external funding agencies including ICMR, DBT, DST, SIDA, WHO and DRDO. From DST, the University has received funds of about Rs. one crore under various research projects during the year. In addition, a large number of students from the Medical and Dental College are being funded by ICMR under ICMR-STS grants.

Dr. Neelu N. Nawani, Associate Professor,

received a grant of about Rs. Three crores from Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency (SIDA) for a collaborative research project between Sweden and India. The main object of the project is to develop the technology for removal of heavy metals from industrial effluents in order to prevent water pollution in Pune caused by industrialization. Research collaborators from India and Sweden deliberate every six months once in each country to review the progress. Dr. Nawani and her team carried out some laboratory studies at Sweden in May 2011 and May 2012. Similarly, scientists from Sweden undertook fieldwork in Pune during December 2011.

One more research project has been granted by SIDA in collaboration with University of Skovde, Sweden for an amount of Rs. 1.50 crores, out of which Rs. 50 lakh have been earmarked for DPU. Dr. M. B. Khetmalas, Dr. Neelu Nawani and Dr. Manish Bodas will be the co-investigators.

It is my pleasure to report that the Doctoral Programme, which was initiated about four years back, has started bearing fruit and today in this convocation, 2 of our faculty members will be awarded their PhD degrees.

#### CONFERENCES, SEMINARS, SYMPOSIA, AND WORKSHOPS

Unless our opinions are put forth and shared with others in the same field and weighed against criticism, they cannot be accepted as evaluated opinions. To this end, Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune seeks every opportunity to organize seminars and symposia on various topics. The University organized various State, National and International Conferences, Seminars, and Workshops during the year under report. The details of some very important conferences and seminars conducted at Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune are as follows:





#### i. INDO-US Education Conclave-2011

Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune along with The Alliance for US India Business (AUSIB) and State Legislative Leaders Foundation (SLLF) organized the first INDO-US Education Conclave of 2011 during December 5-7, 2011 at The Westin Hotel, Pune. The first of its kind in India, the Summit brought together a U.S. delegation comprising of nearly 100 people and over 250 prominent and leading Indian personalities from the field of education and industry, all of whom are committed to promoting quality education, value systems, and governance in the education sector.

The three-day event was an opportunity for leaders in education to interact, deliberate, and find comprehensive solutions to the current issues in the education sector in India and the US. We are very proud to have hosted this historic conclave to forge strong education partnerships between the two biggest democracies of the world.

#### ii. Indo-US Cytometry Workshop

Dr. D. Y. Patil Biotechnology and Bioinformatics Institute organized 12th Indo-US Cytometry Workshop on Applications of Laser Flow Cytometry in Biomedical Research on October 19 – 20, 2011. Dr R. C. Deka, Director, AllMS, New Delhi was the Chief Guest. Dr. Awtar Krishan, Professor of Radiation Oncology, University of Miami School of Medicine, USA and Dr. Shekhar Mande, Director, NCCS, Pune were the guests of honour. Internationally reputed resource persons deliberated and expounded the latest technological developments in Flow Cytometry to about 150 research workers from all over the country.

#### ii. National Workshop on Systems Biology

DPU and Cyborg Sapiens Bioinformatica, Mumbai jointly organized the National Workshop on Systems Biology on April 23, 2011. Dr. Achuthsankar Nair, Director, Centre of Synthetic and Systems Biology, Thiruvanthapuram, Kerala; Dr. Soumen Roy, Professor, Bose Institute Systems Biology programme; and Miss Pradnya Shelke, CEO,

Cyborg Sapiens Bioinformatica, Mumbai were the resource persons.

#### iii. National Conference on Sports Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation

Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil College of Physiotherapy, Pune, organized the First National Conference on Sports Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation (NCSPR - 2012) between February 24 – 26, 2012. It was a huge success in highlighting Sports Physiotherapy as a special and independent discipline. The eminent resource persons included Dr. Ali Irani, former coach of the Indian cricket team and President, Indian Association of Physiotherapists. About 500 delegates across India attended the conference. Pre-conference workshops on Balls, Bands & Tubes along with Fitness Training were conducted by Dr. K. Ganeshan (Sport Physiotherapist) & Dr. Vijaykumar Gandham (Sr. Physiotherapist, A. P. Police) respectively.

#### iv. International Workshop on 'Pune Water Pollution: Status and Remedies

This workshop was organized by the University Jointly with University of Pune, SIDA and University of Skovde, Sweden. The participants in panel discussion included Dr. Cecilia Eriksson (Sweden), Mr. Ravi Behera (Sweden Embassy), Dr. Ananda Kumar Saha (Bangladesh), Dr. Abul Mandal (Sweden), as well as Indian delegates.

#### v. National Symposium on Ethical, Legal and Social Aspects of Medical Practice -2012

The F.M.T. Department, in collaboration with Post Mortem Centre of YCM Hospital, Pimpri organized the National Symposium on Ethical, Legal and Social Aspects of Medical Practice – 2012. About 250 delegates from medical and legal fields attended the Symposium.

vi A symposium was conducted by Department of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery on "Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery update – 2012" between January 19 – 21, 2012.



#### SOCIAL OUTREACH

Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has a strong interface with society at different levels.

- The Out-Patient Departments of the Medical, Dental and Physiotherapy Colleges attract on an average more than 3000 patients every day from the lowerand middle-income groups.
- All indoor patients in our 1290 bedded hospital are provided free treatment along with highly hygienic diet.
- All types of sophisticated investigations such as, MRI, CT Scan, Mammography, Colour Doppler, Ultrasonography, 2D Echo, special procedures, e.g. Dialysis, Endoscopy, Colposcopy, Lithotripsy, EEG, NCV etc. are carried out free of cost for indoor patients.
- The Vidyapeeth runs a Rural Training Health Centre at Alandi, which caters to seven villages and an Urban Training Health Centre at Bhosari on the outskirts of Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation.
- Diagnostic health camps including those for eye-test, blood-group identification, cancer awareness are organized in remote villages with free treatment.

- The Vidyapeeth organizes healthcare camps for senior citizens.
- The Vidyapeeth participates in national health programmes such as Pulse-polio Immunization, Well-baby Clinics, Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme and National Leprosy Eradication Programme.
- Various dental treatments such as tooth extraction are done free and for other hitech dental treatment procedures, such as putting up dental implant, crown & bridge, orthodontic treatment, root canal treatment, only the cost of material is charged from the patients.
- The staff members of nursing college in collaboration with Tata Motors, Colege in Pimpri conducted a training of Village Health Guide for three months. The course included basic health needs along with first-aid treatment and care of antenatal and postnatal mothers and newborns.

#### FACULTY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMMES

Apart from the formal seminars and symposia, the University Departments regularly arrange Continuing Education Programmes in their respective disciplines. These CME, CDE and CNE programmes are aimed at informing the students about newer and latest developments and initiatives in their fields of study so that they are abreast with the cutting edge methodologies when they enter the workforce. Clinical meetings and MET workshops are organized by the colleges for faculty development.

Faculty members also take active part in scientific deliberations at specialty national conferences. At DPU, we believe that continuous enhancement is the crux of academia. I would like to mention the names of a few such meets: International Conference of Virology, Annual Conference of AOI, ISACON, European Respiratory Society Congress, and Pedicon.

In this regard, DPU Chancellor and Vice Chancellor were invited to attend the 13th meeting of International Association of University President (IAUP), held at New York in June 2011, in order to have international collaborations with various leading Universities so as to rope in the best available facilities for the students to attain global knowledge.

Highlight of the visit was the highly meaningful discussion with various authorities of John Hopkins University, Baltimore, University of Maryland, Medical Center of George Washington University, University of the District of Columbia, and School of Dental Medicine at State University of New York to evaluate the possibilities of mutual cooperation.

They were also invited to attend the Conference of Executive Heads of the Association of Commonwealth Universities at Hong Kong.

#### MOUS SIGNED

The following collaborations were finalised by DPU with other distinguished universities:

- 1. Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune, and Dongseo University, Busan, Korea have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding for educational and scientific cooperation. The two Universities will now undertake a programme of exchange of research scientists, faculty members, students, academic materials and other relevant information. Joint research projects, special short term training programmes shall also be undertaken along with joint participation in seminars and academic meetings of mutual interest.
- 2. Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has entered into a Cooperative Agreement with University of Iberoamerica, San Jose, Costa Rica with the objective of developing mutual collaboration towards cooperative efforts, promoting exchange of faculty, students as well as academic and research information of mutual interest.
- 3. An MoU between Dr. D. Y. Patil Biotechnology & Bioinformatics Institute (DYPBBI) & Middle Tennessee State University (MTSU) was signed by Dr. P. D. Patil, Chancellor, Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune and Dr. Sidney A. McPhee, President, MTSU on 7th December, 2011 with the major objectives of joint research

- collaboration and student exchange opportunities for projects and for their PhD research work.
- 4. An MoU between Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune and University of the District of Columbia (UDC, USA) is in final stages of initiation by which joint research work will be carried out in the areas of 'Cell Signaling Pathways in Oral Cancer Biology'. It is proposed to send our faculty/students to carry out this work at UDC and to arrange for UDC scientists to work at DPU.
- 5. An MoU has been signed with International Longevity Centre-India (ILC-I) for various activities of Senior Citizens. Accordingly, the first of the health camps was held in village Takve, Maval taluka on 15th May 2012 and nearly 200 patients, including senior citizens, availed of this facility.
- 6. In March this year, an MoU has been signed for academic collaboration in Health Research & Education between our University and John Hopkins University, Baltimore- Maryland (USA) and initially, we have started monthly Video conferences.

#### **VIDEO CONFERENCING**

As stated earlier, Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College has achieved a major breakthrough in terms of technological medical intervention. On March 22, a video conference was arranged with John Hopkins Hospital, USA for the presentation of noteworthy cases to the international medical fraternity, which was received in an excellent and positive manner.

The Video Conference is conducted every month on HIV case discussion with Center for Clinical Global Health Education, Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, USA; B. J. Medical College, Pune; and National AIDS Research Institute (NARI), Pune. This Video Conference is also witnessed by other Centres in Chennai, Bangalore and Uganda.

This initiative shall go a long way in international exchange of medical thought and treatment options, helpful especially for critical needs of patients.

#### ABOUT DR. D. Y. PATIL HOSPITAL AND RESEARCH CENTRE, PUNE

A good hospital gives any Medical College a fine learning reputation. The hospital provides ample and varied clinical material to the students, enabling them to be conversant with diverse ailments and various treatment modalities. Padmashree Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College has its own hospital at Pimpri, Pune, backed by a powerful Research Center, well supported by hi-tech equipment.

There are 17 operation theatres having 0.3 micron laminar air filter and piped gas. All OTs are air conditioned, having close circuit cameras fitted on each operation table. The College has excellent ICU and ICCU of 22 beds, NICU of 9 beds, PICU of 5 beds, and Casualty of 30 beds. The Hospital has round the clock facilities of blood bank, Casualty Medical Services, ambulance services, paediatrics and neonatology, mortuary, emergency and trauma care, pharmacy etc.

The current project of Hi-Tech hospital on the campus with a carpet area of 7,25,000 square feet and a provision of additional 1000 beds will have 12 basic OPDs, 10 Super-specialty OPDs and 21 Operation Theatres. There will be facilities for angiography, angioplasty, stent implantation, cardiovascular surgery, pediatric and neonatal surgery, transplantation of kidney and bone marrow and cancer diagnosis and treatment. Air ambulance service will also be provided.

#### EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES BY STUDENTS/ AWARDS/ ACHIEVEMENTS

DPU students are always enthusiastic in celebrating different days on their campus such as
Nurses' Day,
World Alzheimer Day,

and others, related to various health programmes.

Students also zealously participate in arranging and following various week celebrations. These include Dant Dindi Saptah, Sankalp Saptah etc.
These days and weeks are organized exclusively by the students while the faculty merely guide them and channelize their efforts.

- As part of industry-academia interaction, industrial tours for management and Biotechnology students have given them great exposure to the working in industry/research laboratories.
- Intercollegiate Competition on Building Scientific Models was organized with the themes 'Modeling Science', 'Reduce Recycle Reuse', 'Safety in Science Laboratory', 'Alternate Energy', and 'Environment Pollution'. Prize winning models were appreciated with cash awards. A Poster-Presentation competition was organized for the students on the occasion.
- Furthermore, the health science campuses organized several camps for the needy, which were again monitored by the faculty but handled entirely by the students. This is a good way of exposing the students to the realities of the working world. Some examples of such camps are diagnostic camps, blood donation camps and geriatric health camps.
- Our students have also brought laurels to the institute by procuring 1st and 2nd positions in various inter collegiate cultural competitions held across the city and state. Their prowess lies in dance, acting, singing, decorative arts and so on.

#### FORTHCOMING EVENTS

Before closing the last year's report, it seems but proper to mention some of the niche forthcoming events that DPU plans to host or undertake next year. Here is a quick glance:

- 1. The Department of Oral Pathology and Microbiology at Dr. D. Y. Patil Dental College will be organizing "XIIth National Post-Graduate Convention of IAOMP" on 14-15 July, 2012, wherein eminent oral pathologists of international repute will participate and deliberate on various issues and aspects of Oral & Maxillofacial Pathology. 600 participants have already registered for this premier event. Dr. V. M. Katoch, Secretary (DHR) & DG, ICMR has kindly consented to be the Chief Guest.
- 2. DPU along with International Longevity Centre, India Chapter proposes to hold a one-day workshop on 22nd June 2012 for about 150 to 200 participants on "Planning for Retirement", to address the emerging challenge of the 21st century, namely the Longevity Revolution. In this workshop, Health, Finance, Legal and Social aspects of the ageing process will be focused upon. Experts will provide invaluable guidance and tips on how to make ageing a qualitative, healthy, productive and dignified process. Under the joint collaboration with ILC-I and the United Nations International Institute on Ageing, Malta (UN INIA), it is proposed to have a seven-day Certificate Course on Gerontology for which international
- faculty shall deliver lectures. The Director of UN INIA, Dr. Joseph Troisi, will himself be one of the international faculty members. The participants, who can be from any field and of any age over 21 years, will be given certificates from the UN. This course seeks to give a comprehensive and holistic view on global ageing and its various issues. This would be an international collaboration, under the aegis of a UN institution.
- 3. 13th Indo-US Flow Cytometry Workshop will be held on 4th and 5th October, 2012, wherein internationally reputed resource persons from University of Miami, USA and other international centres will discuss the advance developments in Flow Cytometry with about 150 research scientists working on Flow Cytometry in India.

With this, I close my report and congratulate each and every faculty member and student for their excellent work and the laurels that they have brought to this University.



## Phri Mohan Pharia

Shri Mohan Dharia, a highly respected freedom fighter, social worker, parliamentarian, administrator and environmentalist is internationally known for his contributions to social and political life, and to environment-related causes.

Educated at the Fergusson College and the ILS Law College, Pune, he enrolled himself as an advocate of the Bombay Kigh Court but, having previously participated in the Freedom Movement, soon entered active social and political life. He was elected to the Pune Municipal Corporation in 1957 and then successively rose to be a Member of Parliament (both Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha), Minister of State in the Union Government, Cabinet Minister and Deputy Chairman, Planning Commission of the Government of India. During his parliamentary days, he was part of the famed quartet known as the Young Turks. He was also General Secretary of the Maharashtra Congress Committee and a member of the All India Congress Committee.

In later life Shri Dharia has worked tirelessly for the cause of the cooperative movement and of the environment. He founded Vanarai, an organization that has propagated the cause of environment rejuvenation and has been responsible for changes in governmental policies related to development through people's involvement. He has also contributed substantially to the cause of wasteland development, forestry management and water conservation. Shri Dharia has brought together various voluntary organizations under a 'Confederation of NSOs in Rural India' of which he is the Chairman. He is the Chairman of the Development Initiative for Self Help and Awakening' (DISHA).

Shri Mohan Dharia is the recipient of a large number of prestigious awards including the the Padma Vibhushan by, the Government of India, the Indira Priyadarshini Vrikshamitra Award and Rajiv Gandhi Paryavaran Mitra Puraskar.

I visited Gawdewadi village in Pune District which he helped develop as a self reliant village. I was deeply impressed with the

This means-'Medical science is like a light which gives much wisdom and deep insight.' The reason why I have quoted from our ancient texts is to emphasize the age old primacy given to the study of health and medicine in our country. It reminds us, on the one hand, of the traditional Indian systems of medicine, which are a part of our heritage and should be

Research has been fundamental in finding cures for many diseases, as also for improving understanding of the functioning of the human body. There have been many revolutionary discoveries, but yet the field is wide open for further work. Medical institutions must keep in touch continuously with advances in medical sciences and incorporate reliable, newer and most sophisticated diagnostic and therapeutic technologies, and update their curriculum regularly. We have entered the age of laser surgery and already there is much talk of robotic surgery. In biotechnology, stem cell



research and artificial intelligence have huge scope for investigations and findings, in addition to many other fields, which we may not even known today. It is for scientists to discover them. We must encourage research in institutions of higher learning. It is also important that healthcare professionals continue to maintain and develop their knowledge and skills. This is all the more important in our country, where there are large numbers of people who require medical services.

As you begin your careers, you would no doubt be aware about the health sector scenario in India in terms of its challenges and its promise. Today, the penetration of health services is unequal and is particularly low in rural areas where medical facilities are limited and often located some distance away. Also, accessibility for all sections of society to health services is uneven. In the context of the national objective of inclusive growth, it must also include inclusive health, which means providing accessible, affordable and quality healthcare to all. Innovative management is required for heath delivery systems. I suggest that there should be specialized courses in management of health facilities in management courses and in medical studies.

I believe that our health system should become affordable and must assume the responsibility of not only treating people, but should also focus on prevention and early diagnosis of disease. Many of the prominent non-communicable diseases are often linked with unhealthy diet and lack of physical activity. It requires change in lifestyle, so that these can be largely prevented and controlled. This requires creating awareness. In this too, medical educational institutes can be helpful by holding awareness camps. encourage this University to take such initiatives. At the same time, the modern system of medicine should also have an open mind to alternative therapies and traditional medicine systems and should create inquiry about these as well.

I am informed that you have an Institute of Distance Learning. Efforts should also be made not only to use this technology to bring knowledge to your students from some of the best medical colleges in India and abroad, but also to treat patients in the surrounding villages through tele-medicine. It also helps in knowledge sharing between different hospitals and doctors. I am happy to learn that the Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune, has been holding discussions on increasing academic collaboration with other institutions including those of other countries. I understand that in this context, it organized the INDO-US Education Conclave in December 2011.

#### Dear students,

I will emphasize some aspects, which you must bear in mind if you are to do well in studies and life. Use your time in college and university to acquire what in the Upanishads is called "tejas" which means a brilliant mind, and "viveka" meaning good sense to understand life, with its duties and responsibilities. You will require not only knowledge and discipline, but also the desire from within to perform the task at hand with excellence. Work with singleminded devotion to achieve your goals. Focusing on what you are doing will give you the capacity to understand issues in depth and to deal with situations in a balanced manner. This is an essential quality for medical professionals who handle issues of people's well-being and good health.

Medical education is comparatively costly but then do not be in a hurry to recover all the costs in the shortest possible time. Try to be true to your profession, which in addition to earnings, is also a service to humanity. At the same time, you also have a duty towards nation building. I urge the young doctors present here this morning to devote some years of their professional lives to working in rural areas. By serving in rural areas not only would you be doing good work for the nation, but the stint will be a valuable addition to your professional experience.

For those of you who are graduating from the faculty of Nursing, I must mention that nursing personnel are an integral part of any healthcare system. No medical team is complete without them. In fact, a good medical facility is highly dependent on the quality of its nursing. Nurses also have to ensure that doctors' instructions are carried out thoroughly in respect of the patient. Thus, nurses, in a very special way, serve as a link between doctors and patients.

As you leave this campus today, and as some of you begin preparations for your further studies in medicines, while others prepare themselves to practice medicine, all of you should be conscious of the fact that as doctors, wherever you go, faith and trust shall be reposed on you by your patients as well as their relatives. They will look upon you with hope and expectations. Therefore, you must always work to maintain this trust, in your practice and apply your knowledge in a very responsible way. Medicine is an intensely humane and personal endeavour and the doctor-patient relationship itself becomes part of the therapeutic process. While treating patients, always be conscious that you are not treating the body alone, but also the concerns and doubts in their minds about their health as well. Try to reduce their anxiety and give them confidence and hope. Patients should feel that the doctor cares for them because a doctor is like God to patients. I hope that the doctors who are passing out today will also bring laurels to the country with their accomplishments and also serve humanity.

I conclude by wishing success for the future of the Dr. D.Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, its management, faculty and to all its students and the young doctors, who have received their degrees today.


